4.3 NATIONAL DISASTER RESILIENCE PROGRAM FUNDING

EMRC received a grant of \$100,000 from the Natural Disaster Resilience Program as part of a \$6 million grant scheme to reduce Western Australia's vulnerability to natural disasters and is administered in partnership with the State and Commonwealth governments.

The grant will be used to fund the "Understanding and Managing Flood Risk in Perth's Eastern Region" project which will be undertaken in collaboration with the Department of Water with support from the Town of Bassendean and the Cities of Bayswater, Belmont and Swan and the Swan River Trust.

14.2 FINANCIAL REPORT FOR PERIOD ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2015

REFERENCE: D2015/04716

PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with an overview of the Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council's (EMRC's) financial performance for the period ended 28 February 2015.

KEY ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

- Significant year to date budget variances greater than 10% or \$10,000, whichever is the greater, within each nature and type category on the Statement of Financial Activity as at 28 February 2015 have been identified and are reported on in the body of the report.
- Two major commercial clients have reduced the disposal of their commercial tonnages at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility from mid July 2014.
- A review of the 2014/2015 budget has been undertaken to determine avoided operational expenditure and deferred capital expenditure resulting from the reduced tonnages, as well as identify other organisational savings in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from commercial clients.

Recommendation(s)

That Council receives the Statement of Comprehensive Income, Capital Expenditure Statement, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash and Investments and the Investment Report for the period ended 28 February 2015.

SOURCE OF REPORT

BACKGROUND

It is a requirement of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 (Clause 34) that a Local Government is to prepare and present to Council financial reports in such a form as the Local Government considers to be appropriate.

The 2014/2015 Budget was presented in a format that separated operating income and expenditure from other revenue and expenses to provide improved disclosure of Council's underlying operating result.

Submitted to each meeting of Council is a financial report and summaries which provide an overview of year to date budget performance for operating activities and capital works. Variances greater than 10% or \$10,000, whichever is the greater, within each nature and type category on the Statement of Comprehensive Income are reported on in the body of the report. Also included are end of year forecasts by nature and type for operating activities and end of year forecasts for each capital works project. These forecasts are reviewed regularly in order to provide an accurate forecast of the end of year result.

An initial review of the 2014/2015 budget was undertaken and reported to Council in December 2014 to determine avoided operational expenditure and deferred capital expenditure resulting from the reduced tonnages, as well as identify other organisational savings in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from commercial clients (Ref: D2014/12545).

The latest forecast review was undertaken during January/February 2015 as part of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 (r. 33A) requirement to carry out a review of its annual budget for the year. This was subject to a report submitted to the March 2015 meeting of Council via the Audit Committee meeting held on 5 March 2015 (Ref: D2015/01133).

REPORT

Outlined below are financial statements for the period ended 28 February 2015. Where possible the year to date monthly budget allocations have been reviewed in order to match the appropriate timing for the various projects budgeted to be undertaken. Year to date budgets have also been adjusted to reflect the year end forecasts following the recent forecast review. This will provide a better comparison between the year to date actual and year to date budget figures.

Statement of Comprehensive Income - Nature and Type (refer Attachment 1)

The year to date operating result from normal activities as at 28 February 2015 is an unfavourable variance of \$633,195 (10.93%) against the adopted 2014/2015 annual budget. The following information is provided on key aspects of Council's end of year financial performance:

Operating Income	Year to Date	An unfavourable variance of \$4,865,144 (17.85%).
	End of Year Forecast	An unfavourable variance of \$7,353,007 (17.72%).

Operating Income variances previously reported to Council:

1. Year to date User Charges of \$18,115,099 is \$5,759,357 (24.12%) below the budget of \$23,874,456. This is due to the lower than budget tonnages forecast to be received from two major commercial operators as reported to Council at its December 2014 meeting. As a consequence, strategies to secure extra volume and a reforecasting of operational expenditure to match revised tonnage estimates have and continue to be undertaken.

As a result of a tonnages forecast review the full year User Charges has been forecast to be below the budget of \$36,459,392 by \$8,679,224 (23.81%). This is based on a forecast total of 242,464 tonnes to be received compared to the budget total of 295,639 tonnes.

Also contributing to the variance is the reduction of the Carbon Tax (2014/2015 budget provision of \$2,031,250) which was repealed effective 1 July 2014.

2. Year to date Interest on Municipal Cash Investments is \$167,771 (146.92%) above the budget of \$114,192. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate received (3.68%) compared to the budgeted rate (3.28%).

The full year forecast for Interest on Municipal Funds is \$238,896 (139.46%) above the budget of \$171,300. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate received (3.60% forecast to June 2015) compared to the budgeted rate (3.28%). Also contributing is the lower level of capital expenditure which has been forecast to be \$10,442,863 below the budget of \$30,410,929.

3. Year to date Reimbursements of \$976,930 is \$450,586 (85.61%) above the budget of \$526,344. This is primarily attributable to a reimbursement of \$417,339 and an accrual of \$294,873 relating to the Hazelmere woodwaste grinder insurance claim which directly off-sets the expenses relating to the insurance claim. This amount is also offset by the reimbursement of carbon tax estimated at \$240,000.

Full year Reimbursements of \$1,397,461 has been forecast to be above the budget of \$789,589 by \$607,872 (76.99%). This is primarily attributable to the Hazelmere woodwaste grinder insurance claim which directly off-sets the expenses relating to the insurance claim (\$894,000). This amount is also off-set by the reimbursement of carbon tax estimated at \$240,000.

4. Year to date Other Income of \$1,593,842 is \$272,874 (20.66%) above the budget of \$1,320,968. The major factor attributable to this variance is the sale of laterite of \$473,457 compared to a budget of \$310,000.

The full year forecast for Other Income of \$2,474,168 is \$522,668 (26.78%) above the budget of \$1,951,000. Major factors contributing to this variance include the sale of greenwaste products which is expected to be \$105,000 (22.34%) above the budget of \$470,000, the sale of laterite forecast to be \$200,000 (55.56%) above the budget of \$360,000 and income from the sale of woodwaste products forecast to be \$89,000 (14.57%) above the budget of \$611,000.

There were no further significant Operating Income variances as at 28 February 2015.

Operating Expenditure variances previously reported to Council:

- 1. Year to date Salary Expenses of \$5,083,927 is \$1,053,273 (17.16%) lower than the budget of \$6,137,200. The variance is attributable to vacant positions and budgeted new positions yet to be filled. A wages and salaries forecast review was undertaken as part of the half year budget review.
- 2. Year to date Contract Expenses of \$2,297,773 is \$1,029,046 (30.93%) below the budget of \$3,326,819 due to the timing of various projects from the business units. Major variances from the Waste Services directorate include:
 - Remove and crush laterite caprock \$333,328;
 - Manage Greenwaste mulching \$177,165; and
 - Rehabilitate Class III Landfill cells (Red Hill) \$100,785.

Other projects where the year to date expenditures are lower than budget for various directorates/business units include: Corporate Services (\$157,747), Environmental Services (\$206,626) and Regional Development projects (\$146,141).

This is offset by projects from Waste Services activities where net expenditure exceeds the budget by \$92,747.

3. Year to date Material Expenses of \$402,174 has been forecast to be \$97,296 (19.48%) below the budget of \$499,470. Directorates/business units where the year to date expenditures are lower than budget include: Corporate Services (\$28,534), Environmental Services (\$9,077), Regional Development (\$11,344) and Waste Services (\$48,416).

Full year Material Expenses of \$936,135 has been forecast to be \$179,076 (16.06%) below the budget of \$1,115,211. The following operational expenditures for various directorate/business units have been identified as potential savings or deferments in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from lower commercial tonnages received on the 2014/2015 Budget: Corporate Services (\$47,074), Environmental Services (\$32,763), Regional Development (\$10,350) and Waste Services (\$88,689).

4. Year to date Utility Expenses of \$146,137 is \$62,996 (30.12%) below the budget of \$209,133. The variance is primarily attributable to a reduction in electricity expenses associated with the wood waste grinder at the Hazelmere site.

Full year Utility Expenses of \$229,011 is \$84,790 (27.02%) below the budget of \$313,801 also for the reason detailed above.

5. Year to date Insurance Expenses of \$929,622 is \$686,752 (282.77%) above the budget of \$242,870. The variance relates to expenditure to date of \$713,211 associated with the Hazelmere woodwaste grinder repairs. This additional expenditure will be claimable and recouped through insurance.

Full year Insurance Expenses of \$1,207,828 is \$867,749 (255.16%) above the budget of \$340,079 and is attributable to the grinder repairs as detailed above.

6. Year to date Depreciation Expenses of \$2,593,750 is \$1,283,977 (33.11%) below the budget of \$3,877,727. The variance is primarily attributable to the lower level of commercial tonnages received to date resulting in lower Class III cell air space consumption (\$944,117 compared to a year to date budget of \$1,158,609), the low level of capital expenditure to date and changes to the asset life of EMRC buildings, plant and equipment in accordance with accounting standards.

Depreciation for the full year has been forecast to be \$2,825,406 (40.51%) below the budget of \$6,974,147. Major factors attributable to this variance are as outlined above.

7. Year to date Miscellaneous Expenses of \$5,651,526 is \$1,123,081 (16.58%) below the budget of \$6,774,607. This variance is mainly attributable to a lower than budgeted landfill levy payable (\$816,768) as a result of the reduced tonnages from commercial operators.

Full year Miscellaneous Expenses of \$9,751,573 is forecast to be \$4,300,597 (30.60%) below the budget of \$14,052,170. This variance is attributable to a lower than budgeted landfill levy payable (\$1,987,087) as a result of lower tonnages forecast to be received by year end as well as the reduction of the Carbon Tax provision (\$2,031,250) which was repealed effective 1 July 2014.

- 8. Full year Provision Expenses of \$70,708 is \$16,096 (18.54%) below the budget of \$86,804. This variance relates to the reduction in the provision for Site Rehabilitation as a result of lower tonnages forecast to be received by year end.
- 9. Year to date Costs Allocated of \$383,892 is \$201,658 (110.66%) above the year to date budget of \$182,234. This is attributable to the utilisation of EMRC plant by operations staff on parts of the Class III Cell Stage 15 construction rather than being undertaken by contractors, which will save on the capital cost of the new landfill cell.

Operating Expenditure variances not previously reported to Council:

1. Year to date Fuel Expenses of \$499,487 is \$68,457 (12.05%) below the budget of \$567,944. The variance is primarily attributable to the lower level of diesel fuel used by plant as a result of lower tonnages received to date. Also attributable to the variance is the lower than budgeted price for the purchase of diesel fuel.

There were no further significant Operating Expenditure variances as at 28 February 2015.

Other Revenues and Expenses variances previously reported to Council:

- 1. Full year Secondary Waste Charge of \$4,504,300 is \$643,137 (12.49%) below the budget of \$5,147,437. This is based on a forecast total of 242,464 tonnes being received compared to the budget total of 295,639 tonnes.
- 2. Year to date Interest on Restricted Cash Investments is \$445,359 (46.06%) above the budget of \$966,880. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate received (3.68% to February 2015) compared to the budgeted rate (3.28%).
 - The full year forecast for Interest on Restricted Cash Investments is \$308,446 (21.27%) above the budget of \$1,450,386. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate of 3.60% forecast over the twelve months compared to the budgeted rate of 3.28%.
- 3. Full year Proceeds from Sale of Assets of \$383,195 is \$38,745 (11.25%) above the budget of \$344,450. This is predominantly attributable to the compensation received for the resumption of a portion of the land at Hazelmere for the Lloyd Street extension (\$47,000) and is off-set by the timing of the disposal of assets.
- 4. Year to date Salary Expenses is \$100,223 (40.26%) below the budget of \$248,908. The variance is attributable to positions yet to be filled as at 28 February 2015.
 - Full year Salary Expenses of \$241,245 is \$220,256 (47.73%) below the budget of \$461,501. The variance is attributable to budgeted positions forecast not to be filled by year end due to the timing of Resource Recovery Park projects.
- 5. Year to date Contract Expenses is \$229,153 (44.13%) below the budget of \$519,233. The variance is due to the timing of the Resource Recovery Project and the associated consultancy expenditure.
 - Full year Contract Expenses of \$836,775 is \$185,536 (18.15%) below the budget of \$1,022,311.
- 6. Full Year Depreciation Expenses is \$37,842 (94.71%) below the budget of \$39,954. The variance is due to the timing of capital expenditure associated with Resource Recovery projects.
- 7. Year to date Miscellaneous Expenses is \$74,069 (77.96%) below the budget of \$95,004. The variance is due to the timing of the Resource Recovery Project and associated tasks.
 - Full year Miscellaneous Expenses of \$53,383 has been forecast to be \$67,991 (56.02%) below the budget of \$121,374.

There were no further significant Other Revenues and Expenses variances as at 28 February 2015.

Capital Expenditure variances:

A favourable variance of \$3,217,941 exists as at 28 February 2015 when compared to the year to date budget of \$5,009,481. The year to date budget provisions are used as a guide only as expenditure of a capital nature is undertaken as and when required.

Major capital expenditures to 28 February 2015 include:

- Construct Class III Stage 15 Cell Red Hill Facility \$725,998;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Hazelmere \$526,383;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Red Hill Facility \$248,101;
- Purchase Vehicles Red Hill Facility \$100,526;
- Purchase Information Technology & Communication Equipment \$28,963; and
- Construct Roads/Carparks Red Hill Facility \$26,880.

The Capital Expenditure budgets as at year end were reviewed in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from the reduction of commercial tonnages on the 2014/2015 Budget and as part of the half year budget review.

Full Year Capital Expenditure has been forecast to be \$10,442,863 (34.34%) below the budget of \$30,410,929.

Full Year significant reductions to capital budgets that have been reduced or deferred include the following:

- Purchase Resource Recovery Park Wood Waste to Energy Plant and Equipment \$2,935,000;
- Purchase Resource Recovery Park C & I Building Plant and Equipment \$1,700,000;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Hazelmere \$1,340,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park C & I Building \$1,050,000;
- Construct Class III Landfill Cell Farm Stage 3 Red Hill Facility \$820,000;
- Construct Class III Landfill Cell Stage 14 Red Hill Facility \$800,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park Wood Waste to Energy Building \$625,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park Site Infrastructure \$500,000;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Red Hill Facility \$300,000;
- Purchase Information Technology and Communication Equipment \$209,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park Weighbridges (x2) \$150,000;
- Purchase / Replace Other Equipment Red Hill Facility \$146,000;
- Construct Roads/Carparks Red Hill Facility \$100,000; and
- Construct Nutrient Stripping Pond Red Hill Facility \$86,000.

This is offset by an increase in the following Capital Expenditure budget provisions following a review of the capital expenditure program:

- Leachate Project Red Hill Landfill Facility \$650,000; and
- Construct Monitoring Bores Red Hill Landfill Facility \$122,000.

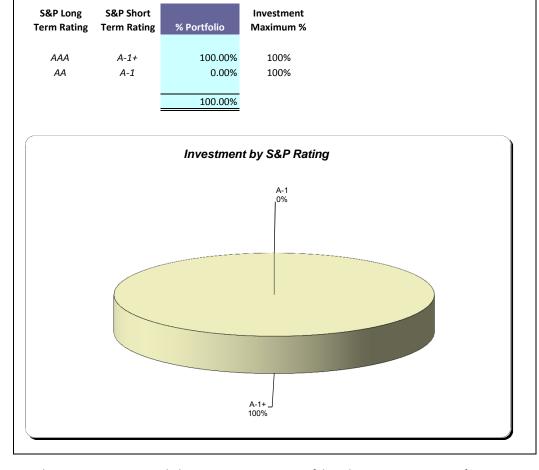

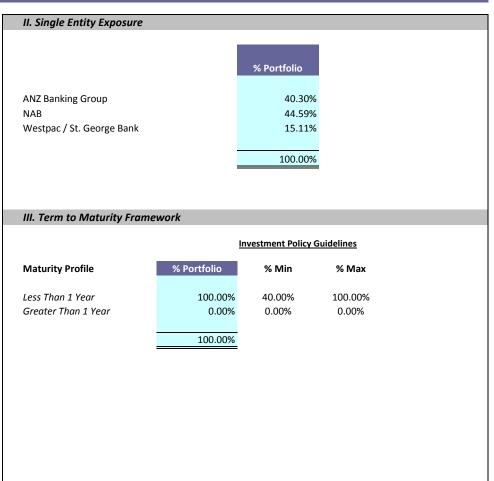

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To amend the schedule of fees and charges for mattress disposal.

KEY ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

- The EMRC's method of processing mattresses received at Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park has changed recently.
- To ensure the viability of the mattress processing operation it is proposed to increase the fee for mattress disposal from 1 May 2015.

Recommendation(s)

That:

- 1. Council by absolute majority, in accordance with section 6.16 of the Local Government Act 1995, adopts the amended fees and charges for mattress disposal for 2014/2015 as contained within the report.
- 2. The amended fees and charges for mattress disposal take effect from 1 May 2015.

SOURCE OF REPORT

BACKGROUND

The fees and charges for 2014/2015 were set as part of the budget process in July 2014.

In August 2014 (Ref: D2014/09886), Council resolved that:

"THAT COUNCIL BY ABSOLUTE MAJORITY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 6.16(3)(B) OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995, ADOPTS THE AMENDED FEES AND CHARGES FOR 2014/2015 FORMING AN ATTACHMENT TO THIS REPORT."

This resolution had the effect of removing the carbon price component of the fees and charges in accordance with the change in the legislation in 2014.

REPORT

The mattress processing operation at Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park has been operational since 2008. Until earlier this year, the mattress processing operation has employed several staff to handle and disassemble the mattresses and recycle the foam rubber and mattress springs. The foam rubber is compressed into bales and sent by shipping container to Sydney where it is converted into carpet underlay by Dunlop. The mattress springs have been stockpiled pending a market for the springs either as is or in a baled or shredded form.

In recent years there has been no market for the spring steel and the stripped mattress inner springs have been stockpiled in anticipation for the market demand changing.



Unfortunately this market has not recovered and there may be a cost in disposing of the existing stockpiles of inner springs to scrap metal merchants.

With the assistance of a Waste Authority grant of \$100K, processing of mattresses at Hazelmere is now being done with the new Hammel shredder. The Hammel does have an overband magnet for recovery of the shredded spring steel but the use of this magnet is being reviewed because of remnant mattress fluff in the shredded springs and metal recyclers unwillingness to take the by-product due to an Australian wide drop in scrap metal prices. Until the market recovers, the shredded mattresses including the shredded spring steel are being disposed of at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility.

An increase in the disposal fee for the mattresses is therefore required to cover the additional costs of processing inclusive of disposal to landfill. Proposed increases to the fees for mattress disposal from 1 May 2015 are as follows:

PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide a Draft Schedule of Fees and Charges for consideration by Council so that preliminary work on the Draft 2015/2016 Budget can be undertaken.

KEY ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

- Commercial tonnages received at Red Hill Waste Management Facility have continued to decline in 2014/2015.
- Landfill cell construction costs have continued to rise, mainly driven by higher standards of construction and monitoring required by the Department of Environment and Regulation.
- New landfill stages constructed on Lot 12 in the next two financial years will need to be accompanied by environmental offset programs because of remnant vegetation clearing adding more costs.
- Because of these factors, it is proposed to increase the member Council base waste disposal fee to \$56.05/tonne (ex. GST), an increase of \$3.50 on the 2014/2015 base rate.
- The member Council contribution to the Secondary Waste Reserve is proposed to be increased by \$2.00/tonne to \$32.00/tonne (ex. GST).
- The State Government's Landfill Levy of \$55.00/tonne (ex. GST) will remain unchanged until 1 July 2016.
- The total member Council general waste disposal fee is proposed to be increased to \$146.55 (ex. GST), an increase of \$5.50/tonne over the 2014/2015 general waste disposal fee after allowing for the removal of the carbon tax component.
- The disposal fee for commercial waste is proposed to be increased to \$145.45/tonne (ex. GST) an
 increase of \$1.81/tonne or 1.24% to attract commercial waste.
- The disposal fee for member Council greenwaste is proposed to be increased from \$42.18/tonne (ex. GST) to \$45.00/tonne (ex. GST); that for MGB greenwaste be increased from \$96.05/tonne (ex. GST) to \$101.55/tonne (ex. GST) and for commercial uncontaminated greenwaste from \$56.36/tonne (ex. GST) to \$60.00 tonne (ex. GST).

Recommendation(s)

SOURCE OF REPORT

BACKGROUND

Each year a Draft Schedule of Fees and Charges is prepared and, after consideration by Council, used in the development of the Draft Budget for the forthcoming year.

At the meeting held 2 June 1999 (Ref: DMDOC/104171) Council resolved that funds, for the proposed secondary waste processing facility, should be set aside and that a contribution of \$2.00/tonne, on each tonne of member Council waste, be put into a reserve fund and that each subsequent year the contribution be increased by \$2.00/tonne.

At the meeting held 2 December 2004 (Ref: DMDOC/27617) Council resolved to adopt 'volume' discounts for commercial entities delivering large quantities of waste so as to provide incentives for large volumes of waste to be delivered and thus generate surpluses.

REPORT

Increases in the base waste disposal fee for member Councils has been maintained at or under inflation for the past decade. This has been possible largely because of the volumes of commercial waste received at Red Hill Waste Management Facility which has help to offset increases in the member rate.

Due to a combination of the increased landfill levy and commercial waste collectors directing waste to their own private landfills, commercial tonnages received at Red Hill have declined significantly and are forecast to be around 78,000 tonnes in 2014/2015 compared to the forecast of 135,000 tonnes of municipal waste from member Councils. This compares to 131,587 tonnes of commercial waste and 133,457 tonnes of member Council waste in 2013/2014 and 210,376 tonnes of commercial waste and 136,114 tonnes of member Council waste in 2007/2008.

Furthermore, landfill cell construction costs have continued to rise, mainly driven by higher standards of construction and monitoring required by the Department of Environment and Regulation. With the new landfill stages to be constructed on Lot 12 over the next two financial years, the EMRC will need to have an environmental offset program to compensate for the removal of remnant vegetation and black cockatoo nesting and foraging sites, all of which adds cost to the construction of the landfill cells.

The State Government's Landfill Levy for putrescible waste increased to \$55.00/tonne on 1 January 2015 and will remain at this level until 30 June 2016. A five year schedule of levy rates has been announced with progressive increases from 1 July 2016 to \$70/tonne by 1 July 2018.

The setting of fees and charges takes into account a range of costs including fuel, wages and salaries and cell construction and regulatory approval costs as discussed above. As a consequence of this it is proposed the member Council base waste disposal fee be increased to \$56.05/tonne (ex. GST) an increase of \$3.50 on the 2014/2015 base rate.

It is also proposed that the member Council contribution to the Secondary Waste Reserve be increased by \$2.00/tonne to \$32.00/tonne (ex. GST) to continue to build the reserve for the proposed Resource Recovery Facility at Red Hill in line with Council's previous resolution.



The Waste Education Levy of \$3.50/tonne will remain unchanged at \$3.50/tonne for member Councils. This means that the total member Council general waste disposal fee is proposed to be increased to \$146.55 (ex. GST), an increase of \$5.50/tonne or 3.90% over the 2014/2015 general waste disposal fee after allowing for the removal of the carbon tax component.

It is proposed that the fee for the disposal of commercial waste be \$145.45/tonne (ex. GST) an increase of \$1.81/tonne or 1.24% which is expected to remain competitive with other sites in the metropolitan area although there is increasing competition for commercial waste as discussed above.

The asbestos disposal fees have been increased by between 6.67% and 15.36% to cover the cost of labour increases and the increase in airspace costs.

Mattress disposal fees at Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park are proposed to be increased from 1 May 2015 (refer Item 11.1) and have not been increased further.

The disposal fee for member Council greenwaste is proposed to be increased from \$42.18/tonne (ex. GST) to \$45.00/tonne (ex. GST); that for MGB greenwaste be increased from \$96.05/tonne (ex. GST) to \$101.55/tonne (ex. GST) and for commercial uncontaminated greenwaste from \$56.36/tonne (ex. GST) to \$60.00 tonne (ex. GST). This is to cover increased costs of processing and licence compliance.

The disposal fee for wood waste at Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park is proposed to be increased by between 10.00% and 10.23% in line with increased costs on site.

It is proposed that the member Council consulting fees for contaminated sites work and advice on waste management be increased by between 2.02% and 3.45%.

Other disposal fees and the prices for sale of products have been set to cover costs and provide for future investment in the operations.

Volume discounts for commercial waste and contaminated soils received at Red Hill Waste Management Facility within the financial year once the relevant threshold is reached are unchanged as follows:
