11 GENERAL BUSINESS

11.1 RESOURCE RECOVERY PROJECT UPDATE

The Director Waste Services provided an update to the group on the Resource Recovery Facility proposed for the Red Hill Waste Management Facility.

The Director Waste Services advised that a discussion paper for the Resource Recovery Facility contract options was being prepared by Talis Consultants. Once the discussion paper has been reviewed it will be presented to Council for consideration. A timeline for the project implementation will be provided once developed.

The Manager Resource Recovery provided an update to the group on the waste education initiatives.

- Public Recycling Updates:
 - The Battery and CFL collection information was provided for December 2014 and January 2015. In addition the year to date totals from July 2014 to January 2015 have been included;
 - The Battery and CFLs collected from schools, varies monthly for each Council in the region;
 - Six monthly reporting has been completed and sent to all schools and public places in the program. Detailed half yearly location information have been included;
 - o 2015 Public place and schools collection roster has been sent out; and
 - o Goodstart Early Learning Centre in Maida Vale has recently joined the program.

- Tours of Red Hill Waste Management Facility and Education Centre during the reporting period:
 - In January 2015 four tours were undertaken with a total of 72 participants. These included two
 childcare centres, the Catchments, Corridors and Coast professional development course and the
 Green Army from Bridging the Gap; and
 - All schools in the Battery Program have been mailed out Excursion Brochures. It is likely that letter drops will take place over the next month.
- School and Community Engagement/Events:
 - No school or community Events attended during January 2015.
- Event Recycling Trailer:
 - o City of Swan is currently using some of the lids for Midlandia;
 - Town of Bassendean cancelled their booking for Australia Day; and
 - o Bin caps are currently being cleaned. Councils will be required to return lids in clean condition.

• Other projects:

- Discussions continue with the Regional Waste Education Steering Group (RWESG) members about the redesign of Waste and Recycle Guide for 2015/2016;
- o Red Hill Environmental Education Centre Review Draft Report to be released shortly; and
- Recycling data from all Councils is now provided to the EMRC on a monthly basis. Data to be analysed and a public reporting template developed.

11.3 RESOURCE RECOVERY PARK UPDATE

The Manager Resource Recovery provided an update on the Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park progress, the Commercial and Industrial Waste Plant and general site development.

The Manager Resource Recovery advised that Opus International is continuing with the engineering design of the site. A draft detailed design has been completed and a meeting has been held with the designers to discuss the documents. The Manager Resource Recovery and the Project Engineer are reviewing the documents, once the review is complete feedback will be provided to the designers.

The Manager Resource Recovery advised that the extension of the scheme water main to the Hazelmere site has been awarded to Densford Civil and construction is to commence on Monday 15 February 2015 with an expected completion date of 27 February 2015.

The development of a C&I plant for the intake of cardboard, plastic and wood waste from industrial sites is progressing. A decision was made to invite interest from several consultants to design a suitable building for the C&I plant. This will form part of the tender that interested parties will be invited to bid on. It is expected the tender will be advertised in March 2015.

The Manager Resource Recovery advised that the Hammel grinder arrived in early January 2015. CSS Equipment provided handover training to the Supervisor Resource Recovery and staff during the week of 12-16 January 2015. The grinder is currently being used to downsize the incoming waste timber and the stockpiles that have accumulated over the past few months while the HAAS plant has been inoperable. Trials have also been undertaken on mattress shredding with much success. Recycling of spring steel within the mattresses is still being investigated to find a suitable solution.

The repair of the HAAS plant has commenced. The engineer from HAAS commenced removal of the damaged items on 4 February 2015.

The Director Waste Service provided an update on the Hazelmere Wood Waste to Energy Project:

- The amended Response to Submissions incorporating the peer review and the EMRC's response to the peer review recommendations were submitted to the EPA in December 2014;
- Following meetings with the Office of the Environmental Protection Authority (OEPA) the EPA provided a letter in response to the EMRC's advice indicating the present status of the EPA's assessment of the proposal;
- It is proposed to undertake a testing programme of the reformer and syngas treatment system at Anzac's Bunbury plant over the next few months together with a peer review; and
- The EPA has requested further details on the design of the syngas scrubber as part of its assessment.

11.4 UPDATE ON THE WARR ACT REVIEW

The CEO updated the group and advised that the EMRC has prepared a draft response to the WARR Act. This will be presented to Council at the next Ordinary Meeting on the 19 February 2015 for approval.

Ms Katscherian advised that the response was due on 23 February 2015. Ms Katscherian advised members wishing to contribute to the draft submission to have their responses to her prior to 12 February 2015 for inclusion.
