PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with an overview of the Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council's (EMRC's) financial performance for the period ended 31 March 2015.

KEY ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

- Significant year to date budget variances greater than 10% or \$10,000, whichever is the greater, within each nature and type category on the Statement of Financial Activity as at 31 March 2015 have been identified and are reported on in the body of the report.
- Two major commercial clients have reduced the disposal of their commercial tonnages at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility from mid July 2014.
- Reviews of the 2014/2015 budget have been undertaken to reflect avoided operational expenditure and deferred capital expenditure resulting from the reduced tonnages, as well as identify other organisational savings in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from commercial clients.

Recommendation(s)

That Council receives the Statement of Comprehensive Income, Capital Expenditure Statement, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Cash and Investments and the Investment Report for the period ended 31 March 2015.

SOURCE OF REPORT

Director Corporate Services Manager Financial Services

BACKGROUND

It is a requirement of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 (Clause 34) that a Local Government is to prepare and present to Council financial reports in such a form as the Local Government considers to be appropriate.

The 2014/2015 Budget was presented in a format that separated operating income and expenditure from other revenue and expenses to provide improved disclosure of Council's underlying operating result.

Submitted to each meeting of Council is a financial report and summaries which provide an overview of year to date budget performance for operating activities and capital works. Variances greater than 10% or \$10,000, whichever is the greater, within each nature and type category on the Statement of Comprehensive Income are reported on in the body of the report. Also included are end of year forecasts by nature and type for operating activities and end of year forecasts for each capital works project. These forecasts are reviewed regularly in order to provide an accurate forecast of the end of year result.

Item 14.2 continued

An initial review of the 2014/2015 budget was undertaken and reported to Council in December 2014 to determine avoided operational expenditure and deferred capital expenditure resulting from the reduced tonnages, as well as identify other organisational savings in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from commercial clients (Ref: D2014/12545).

The latest forecast review was undertaken during January/February 2015 as part of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 (r. 33A) requirement to carry out a review of its annual budget for the year. This was subject to a report submitted to the March 2015 meeting of Council via the Audit Committee meeting held on 5 March 2015 (Ref: D2015/01133).

Outlined below are financial statements for the period ended 31 March 2015. Where possible the year to date monthly budget allocations have been reviewed in order to match the appropriate timing for the various projects budgeted to be undertaken. Year to date budgets have also been adjusted to reflect the year end forecasts following the recent forecast review. This will provide a better comparison between the year to date actual and year to date budget figures.

Statement of Comprehensive Income - Nature and Type (refer Attachment 1)

The year to date operating result from normal activities as at 31 March 2015 is an unfavourable variance of \$297,792 (4.93%) against the adopted 2014/2015 annual budget. The following information is provided on key aspects of Council's end of year financial performance:

Operating Income variances previously reported to Council:

1. Year to date User Charges of \$20,538,369 is \$6,771,554 (24.80%) below the budget of \$27,309,923. This is due to the lower than budget tonnages forecast to be received from two major commercial operators as reported to Council at its December 2014 meeting. As a consequence, attempts to secure extra volume and a reforecasting of operational expenditure to match revised tonnage estimates have and continue to be undertaken.

As a result of a tonnages forecast review the full year User Charges has been forecast to be below the budget of \$36,459,392 by \$8,679,224 (23.81%). This is based on a forecast total of 242,464 tonnes to be received compared to the budget total of 295,639 tonnes.

Also contributing to the variance is the reduction of the Carbon Tax (2014/2015 budget provision of \$2,031,250) which was repealed effective 1 July 2014.

2. Year to date Interest on Municipal Cash Investments is \$251,129 (195.48%) above the budget of \$128,466. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate received (3.67%) compared to the budgeted rate (3.28%).

The full year forecast for Interest on Municipal Funds is \$238,896 (139.46%) above the budget of \$171,300. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate received (3.60% forecast to June 2015) compared to the budgeted rate (3.28%). Also contributing is the lower level of capital expenditure which has been forecast to be \$10,442,863 below the budget of \$30,410,929.



3. Year to date Reimbursements of \$1,564,262 is \$972,125 (164.17%) above the budget of \$592,137. This is primarily attributable to a reimbursement of \$1,249,784 relating to the Hazelmere woodwaste grinder insurance claim which off-sets the expenses relating to the insurance claim. This amount is also offset by the reimbursement of carbon tax estimated at \$240,000.

Full year Reimbursements of \$1,397,461 has been forecast to be above the budget of \$789,589 by \$607,872 (76.99%). This is primarily attributable to the Hazelmere woodwaste grinder insurance claim which offsets the expenses relating to the insurance claim (\$894,000). This amount is also offset by the reimbursement of carbon tax estimated at \$240,000.

4. Year to date Other Income of \$1,882,153 is \$412,564 (28.07%) above the budget of \$1,469,589. The major factor attributable to this variance is the sale of laterite of \$618,617 compared to a budget of \$330,000.

The full year forecast for Other Income of \$2,474,168 is \$522,668 (26.78%) above the budget of \$1,951,500. Major factors contributing to this variance include the sale of greenwaste products which is expected to be \$105,000 (22.34%) above the budget of \$470,000, the sale of laterite forecast to be \$200,000 (55.56%) above the budget of \$360,000 and income from the sale of woodwaste products forecast to be \$89,000 (14.57%) above the budget of \$611,000.

There were no further significant Operating Income variances as at 31 March 2015.

Operating Expenditure variances previously reported to Council:

- 1. Year to date Salary Expenses of \$5,693,838 is \$1,162,415 (16.95%) lower than the budget of \$6,856,253. The variance is attributable to vacant positions and budgeted new positions yet to be filled. A wages and salaries forecast review was undertaken as part of the half year budget review.
- 2. Year to date Contract Expenses of \$2,800,247 is \$1,097,093 (28.15%) below the budget of \$3,897,340 due to the timing of various projects from the business units. Major variances from the Waste Services directorate include:
 - Remove and crush laterite caprock \$374,994;
 - Manage Greenwaste mulching \$178,889; and
 - Monitor Environmental Impacts Red Hill & Hazelmere sites \$148,307
 - Rehabilitate Class III Landfill cells (Red Hill) \$131,473.

Other projects where the year to date expenditures are lower than budget for various directorates/business units include: Corporate Services (\$213,688), Environmental Services (\$228,162) and Regional Development projects (\$182,108).

This is offset by projects from Waste Services activities where net expenditure exceeds the budget by \$360,528.

3. Year to date Material Expenses of \$504,171 is \$93,995 (15.71%) below the budget of \$598,166. Directorates/business units where the year to date expenditures are lower than budget include: Corporate Services (\$29,846), Environmental Services (\$10,236), Regional Development (\$13,530) and Waste Services (\$40,383).



Full year Material Expenses of \$936,135 has been forecast to be \$179,076 (16.06%) below the budget of \$1,115,211. The following operational expenditures for various directorate/business units have been identified as potential savings or deferments in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from lower commercial tonnages received on the 2014/2015 Budget: Corporate Services (\$47,074), Environmental Services (\$32,763), Regional Development (\$10,350) and Waste Services (\$88,689).

4. Year to date Utility Expenses of \$150,049 is \$63,239 (29.65%) below the budget of \$213,288. The variance is primarily attributable to a reduction in electricity expenses associated with the wood waste grinder at the Hazelmere site.

Full year Utility Expenses of \$229,011 is \$84,790 (27.02%) below the budget of \$313,801 also for the reason detailed above.

- 5. Year to date Fuel Expenses of \$556,784 is \$85,367 (13.29%) below the budget of \$642,151. The variance is primarily attributable to the lower level of diesel fuel used by plant as a result of lower tonnages received to date. Also attributable to the variance is the lower than budgeted price for the purchase of diesel fuel.
- 6. Year to date Insurance Expenses of \$1,164,185 is \$897,086 (335.86%) above the budget of \$267,099. The variance relates to expenditure of \$928,521 associated with the Hazelmere woodwaste grinder repairs. This additional expenditure has been recouped through insurance.

Full year Insurance Expenses of \$1,207,828 is \$867,749 (255.16%) above the budget of \$340,079 and is attributable to the grinder repairs as detailed above.

7. Year to date Depreciation Expenses of \$2,922,209 is \$1,653,599 (36.14%) below the budget of \$4,575,808. The variance is primarily attributable to the lower level of commercial tonnages received to date resulting in lower Class III cell air space consumption (\$1,055,565 compared to a year to date budget of \$1,302,247), the low level of capital expenditure to date and changes to the asset life of EMRC buildings, plant and equipment in accordance with accounting standards.

Depreciation for the full year has been forecast to be \$2,825,406 (40.51%) below the budget of \$6,974,147. Major factors attributable to this variance are as outlined above.

8. Year to date Miscellaneous Expenses of \$6,688,920 is \$1,404,564 (17.35%) below the budget of \$8,093,484. This variance is mainly attributable to a lower than budgeted landfill levy payable (\$1,026,126) as a result of the reduced tonnages from commercial operators.

Full year Miscellaneous Expenses of \$9,751,573 is forecast to be \$4,300,597 (30.60%) below the budget of \$14,052,170. This variance is attributable to a lower than budgeted landfill levy payable (\$1,987,087) as a result of lower tonnages forecast to be received by year end as well as the reduction of the Carbon Tax provision (\$2,031,250) which was repealed effective 1 July 2014.

- 9. Full year Provision Expenses of \$70,708 is \$16,096 (18.54%) below the budget of \$86,804. This variance relates to the reduction in the provision for Site Rehabilitation as a result of lower tonnages forecast to be received by year end.
- Year to date Costs Allocated of \$407,657 is \$202,708 (98.91%) above the year to date budget of \$204,949. This is attributable to the utilisation of EMRC plant by operations staff on parts of the Class III Cell Stage 15 construction rather than being undertaken by contractors, which will save on the capital cost of the new landfill cell.

There were no further significant Operating Expenditure variances as at 31 March 2015.

Other Revenues and Expenses variances previously reported to Council:

- 1. Full year Secondary Waste Charge of \$4,504,300 is \$643,137 (12.49%) below the budget of \$5,147,437. This is based on a forecast total of 242,464 tonnes being received compared to the budget total of 295,639 tonnes.
- 2. Year to date Interest on Restricted Cash Investments is \$448,625 (41.24%) above the budget of \$1,087,740. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate received (3.67% to March 2015) compared to the budgeted rate (3.28%).

The full year forecast for Interest on Restricted Cash Investments is \$308,446 (21.27%) above the budget of \$1,450,386. This is attributable to the higher level of funds available as at 30 June 2014 compared to budget together with a higher average interest rate of 3.60% forecast over the twelve months compared to the budgeted rate of 3.28%.

3. Year to date Proceeds from Sale of Assets of \$416,065 is \$213,365 (105.26%) above the budget of \$202,700. This is predominantly attributable to the compensation received for the resumption of a portion of the land at Hazelmere for the Lloyd Street extension (\$47,000) together with proceeds from the sale of plant totalling \$228,383 compared to a budget of \$100,000. The plant disposals were undertaken after the finalisation of the half year budget review is therefore not reflected in the full year forecast.

Full year Proceeds from Sale of Assets of \$383,195 is \$38,745 (11.25%) above the budget of \$344,450. This is predominantly attributable to the compensation received for the resumption as detailed above.

4. Year to date Salary Expenses is \$112,311 (40.39%) below the budget of \$278,067. The variance is attributable to positions yet to be filled as at 31 March 2015.

Full year Salary Expenses of \$241,245 is \$220,256 (47.73%) below the budget of \$461,501. The variance is attributable to budgeted positions forecast not to be filled by year end due to the timing of Resource Recovery Park projects.

5. Year to date Contract Expenses is \$265,516 (45.44%) below the budget of \$584,328. The variance is due to the timing of the Resource Recovery Project and the associated consultancy expenditure.

Full year Contract Expenses of \$836,775 is \$185,536 (18.15%) below the budget of \$1,022,311.

- 6. Full Year Depreciation Expenses is \$37,842 (94.71%) below the budget of \$39,954. The variance is due to the timing of capital expenditure associated with Resource Recovery projects.
- 7. Year to date Miscellaneous Expenses is \$77,310 (78.53%) below the budget of \$98,442. The variance is due to the timing of the Resource Recovery Project and associated tasks.

Full year Miscellaneous Expenses of \$53,383 has been forecast to be \$67,991 (56.02%) below the budget of \$121,374.

There were no further significant Other Revenues and Expenses variances as at 31 March 2015.

Capital Expenditure Statement (refer Attachment 2)

Capital Expenditure variances:

A favourable variance of \$7,101,415 exists as at 31 March 2015 when compared to the year to date budget of \$9,256,189. The year to date budget provisions are used as a guide only as expenditure of a capital nature is undertaken as and when required.

Major capital expenditures to 31 March 2015 include:

- Construct Class III Stage 15 Cell Red Hill Facility \$750,612;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Hazelmere \$529,870;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Red Hill Facility \$248,101;
- Wood Waste to Energy Pant & Equipment (Contract payment) \$150,000
- Purchase Vehicles Red Hill Facility \$100,526; and
- Purchase Vehicles Ascot Place \$69,823;

The Capital Expenditure budgets as at year end were reviewed in an effort to mitigate the impact of the reduced revenue from the reduction of commercial tonnages on the 2014/2015 Budget and as part of the half year budget review.

Full Year Capital Expenditure has been forecast to be \$10,442,863 (34.34%) below the budget of \$30,410,929.

Full Year significant reductions to capital budgets that have been reduced or deferred include the following:

- Purchase Resource Recovery Park Wood Waste to Energy Plant and Equipment \$2,935,000;
- Purchase Resource Recovery Park C & I Building Plant and Equipment \$1,700,000;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Hazelmere \$1,340,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park C & I Building \$1,050,000;
- Construct Class III Landfill Cell Farm Stage 3 Red Hill Facility \$820,000;
- Construct Class III Landfill Cell Stage 14 Red Hill Facility \$800,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park Wood Waste to Energy Building \$625,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park Site Infrastructure \$500,000;
- Purchase / Replace Plant Red Hill Facility \$300,000;
- Purchase Information Technology and Communication Equipment \$209,000;
- Construct and Commission Resource Recovery Park Weighbridges (x2) \$150,000;
- Purchase / Replace Other Equipment Red Hill Facility \$146,000;
- Construct Roads/Carparks Red Hill Facility \$100,000; and
- Construct Nutrient Stripping Pond Red Hill Facility \$86,000.

This is offset by an increase in the following Capital Expenditure budget provisions following a review of the capital expenditure program:

- Leachate Project Red Hill Landfill Facility \$650,000; and
- Construct Monitoring Bores Red Hill Landfill Facility \$122,000.

Statement of Financial Position (refer Attachment 3)

The Statement of Financial Position shows the overall impact of actual balances compared with budget provisions and end of year forecasts for operating and capital works activities.

It has been forecast that Total Equity as at 30 June 2015 will be above the original budget of \$140,056,224 by \$52,387.

Statement of Cash and Investments (refer Attachment 4)

The level of cash and investments in the Municipal Fund as at 31 March 2015 is \$27,367,698 and Restricted Assets amount to \$52,907,426.

The net movement for the month is an increase of \$4,487,972.

Investment Report (refer Attachment 5)

Term deposits valued at \$5,000,000 which matured in the month of March 2015 were reinvested into further term deposits together with additional funds of \$3,000,000.

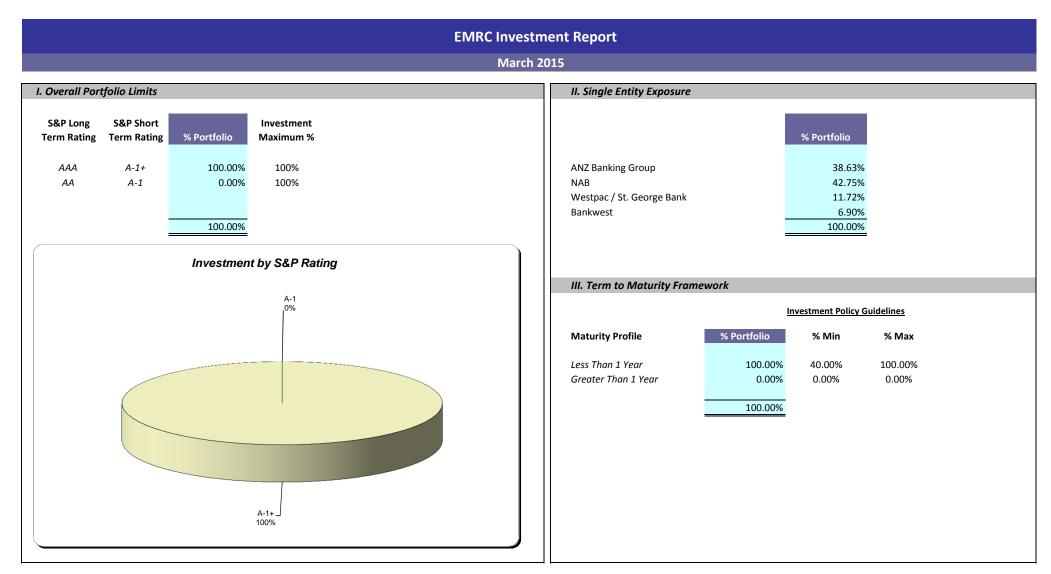

BACKGROUND

Between 2 and 4 Councillors, together with officers, have attended previous Landfill and Transfer Stations Conferences.

At its meeting of 23 May 2013, Council resolved:

"THAT COUNCILLOR(S) CUCCARO AND ZANNINO BE REGISTERED TO ATTEND THE 5^{TH} AUSTRALIAN LANDFILL AND TRANSFER STATIONS CONFERENCE AND EXPO BEING HELD IN QUEENSLAND, AUSTRALIA FROM 8 TO 9 AUGUST 2013."

REPORT

The 6th Australian Landfill and Transfer Stations Conference & Expo: Continuing the Transformation is the latest event in the series of conferences hosted by the National Landfill Division of the Waste Management Association of Australia (WMAA). The 2015 conference is being held at the National Convention Centre in Canberra, details of which are contained within attachment 2.

The focus of the 2015 conference is to draw out experiences from industry and government demonstrating that landfills and transfer stations are essential infrastructure for the management of waste in today's society, as well as for future generations.

Conference papers will be presented on Wednesday, 29 July and Thursday 30 July 2015. Several relevant topics appear on the programme, such as:

- Facility planning and approvals 4 papers;
- Transfer station operation and developments 4 papers;
- Landfill planning and development 3 papers;
- Developments in landfill design and operation 4 papers;
- Improving facility operations 4 papers;
- Landfill gas emission reduction 3 papers;
- Landfill construction and final capping 5 papers; and
- Landfill closure, redevelopment and remediation 5 papers.

The conference topics align to current and future work being undertaken by the EMRC at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility and Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park which is reflected in the Conference Assessment Form (attachment 1).

Pre-conference workshops are available on Monday 27 July 2015 on:

- Leachate Management; and
- Fire Prevention and Management at Waste Handling Facilities.

These cost \$300 per person for WMAA members.

There are also two technical tours available on Tuesday 28 July 2015 costing \$120 per person for:

 - Mitchell Resource Management Centre;
 - Mugga Lane Resource Management Centre;
 - Landtasia Organic Farms;
 - Lunch;

 - Bywong (Macs Reef) Waste Transfer Station.
- 2. Sydney to Canberra:
 - Clyde Transfer Station;
 - Moss Vale Resource Recovery Centre;
 - Lunch;
 - Veolia Woodlawn Bioreactor Landfill; and
 - Bungendore Resource Recovery Facility.

Additional accommodation costs and conference costs would be incurred depending on the attendance options chosen in addition to the above.

For attending the full conference and pre-conference activities from 27 to 30 July 2015, the "early bird" discounted cost is estimated to be \$2,800.00 per attendee (based on package 1), inclusive of airfares, accommodation, conference attendance fees, incidental expenses and meals. The early bird rate closes on 14 May 2015 however the EMRC has requested an extension of this until after the Council meeting on 21 May 2015.

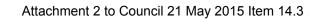

14.4 DELEGATED AUTHORITY – WESTERN AUSTRALIAN BROILER GROWERS ASSOCIATION

REFERENCE: D2015/06740

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Council approval for delegated authority to enter into a new sales agreement with the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association.

KEY ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

- The initial five (5) year sales agreement with the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association to supply their members with wood chip fines from the Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park ended on 30 November 2014.
- Due to the shutdown of the timber grinding operation because of fire damage and uncertainties about product quality with the interim arrangement during the grinder repairs, Western Australian Broiler Growers Association deferred entering into a new agreement at the time.
- With the Haas timber grinder back in operation and supplying acceptable quality product to the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association, a new five (5) year sale agreement has been negotiated.
- The value of the sales agreement over the life of the contract exceeds the delegated authority of the CEO (\$3,000,000) therefore the matter is being referred to Council.

Recommendation(s)

That Council by absolute majority, in accordance with Section 5.42 of the Local Government Act 1995, delegates authority to the CEO to enter into a new five (5) year sales agreement with the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association.

SOURCE OF REPORT

Director Waste Services

BACKGROUND

In October 2009, the EMRC entered into a sales agreement with the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association. This agreement ended on 30 November 2014.

REPORT

The initial five (5) year sales agreement with the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association to supply their members with wood chip fines from the Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park ended on 30 November 2014. Arrangements were being made to renew the agreement however, due to the shutdown of the timber grinding operation because of the fire damage in August 2014 and uncertainties about product quality with the interim arrangements during the grinder repairs, the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association deferred entering into discussions about a new agreement at the time.

When the Haas timber grinder resumed normal operation in March 2015, discussions commenced with the Western Australian Broiler Growers Association for a new five (5) year sales agreement. The commercial terms for the agreement have been reached and the amended agreement has been prepared for execution.

The value of the sales agreement over the five (5) year life of the contract, with indexation as defined in the agreement is forecast to be approximately \$3,200,000 (ex. GST), which exceeds the delegated authority of the CEO for sale of products (\$3,000,000 (ex. GST)). Therefore the matter is being referred to Council to approve a delegation to the CEO for this sale agreement.

11.1 TENDER 2015-002 – HIRE OF VARIOUS PLANT

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To advise Council of the results of Tender 2015-002 for the Hire of Various Plant and recommend a panel of contractors.

KEY ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATION(S)

- A tender for the Hire of Various Plant was advertised in The West Australian newspaper on 4 March 2015 and online at the EMRC Tenderlink website.
- The tender provided for the hire of various pieces of plant.
- Tenders closed on 19 March 2015 with eighteen (18) submissions being received.
- The tender panel will be used to provide various pieces of plant for hire by EMRC to supplement EMRC's own plant and replace those which may become unavailable due to breakdown or servicing.

Recommendation(s)

That:

- 1. Council award Tender 2015-002 to the listed tenderers and for the specific plant items at the rates in the attachment to this report for the period 24 May 2015 to 23 May 2018 with an option of two single year extensions.
- 2. The contract rates for Tender 2015-002 Hire of Various Plant are to be adjusted annually using the Consumer Price Index for Perth at the anniversary of the contract.

SOURCE OF REPORT

Director Waste Services Engineering Technical Officer

BACKGROUND

The EMRC has an operational need to supplement its own plant and replace those items that may become unavailable due to breakdown or general servicing. The EMRC currently has an existing panel for the provision of a range of equipment. These contracts are due to expire on 23 May 2015 and new contracts will be required to ensure that the EMRC can meet short term plant requirements.

REPORT

Tender 2015-002 was advertised in The West Australian on 4 March 2015 seeking prices for the wet and dry hire of a range of equipment. In order to provide for operational flexibility, a panel of suppliers was considered the best purchase option.

Tender 2015-002 was developed to provide for a large range of plant to provide for operational contingencies. The tender covers all EMRC operations at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility and Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park, as well as Coppin Road Transfer Station and Mathieson Road Transfer Station.

The eighteen submissions received were evaluated against compliance criteria, qualitative criteria and price considerations as follows:

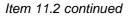

Under the EMRC's plant replacement programme, two Volvo four wheel loaders are due for replacement having reached 8,000 hours of service, one for the Red Hill Waste Management Facility and the other for the Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park.



REPORT

Quotations for the replacement of two (2) four wheel loaders were sought using the WALGA e-quote system in February 2015. Eight companies provided submissions for a total of 11 machines, all of which have been evaluated by Waste Services staff against the selection criteria detailed in the quotation specification.

Submissions were received from Liebherr Australia (L 556 IIB IND), Tutt Bryant Equipment (Kawasaki 85Z7 & 90Z7), Westrac (Caterpillar 962K), Komatsu Australia (WA430-6 & WA470-6), McIntosh & Son (Case 921FXR & 921F), CJD Equipment (Volvo L120F), CEA (JCB 457HT), Hitachi Australia (John Deere 744K Z-Bar).

Selection Criteria and Rating Scale

Each submission was evaluated based on the criteria requested via the WALGA e-quote.

- 2. AUTHORISE THE CEO TO ENTER INTO THE AGREEMENT, ON BEHALF OF THE EMRC, WITH CITY OF BAYSWATER FOR THE PROCESSING OF MATERIAL FROM BAYSWATER'S MOBILE GARBAGE BIN (MGB) GREENWASTE COLLECTION."

The one year extension option in this agreement was exercised in December 2014.

REPORT

The current greenwaste processing agreement between the City of Bayswater and the EMRC is due to expire on 31 December 2015 after two (2) five year terms and the exercising of a one year extension on the current agreement.

The City of Bayswater has requested this six (6) month extension to align the contracts they have for collection of rubbish, greenwaste, recyclables and bulk waste.

The EMRC has no objection to such an extension of the agreement under the same terms.
