### 4. EMRC to be the first to accept Per- and Poly-fluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

The Red Hill Waste Management Facility has led the way in being the first landfill facility in Western Australia to have been awarded a licence to accept per- and poly-fluoroalkyl, or PFAS, contaminated material.

In June 2017, the EMRC sought an amendment to its licence to accept and dispose of PFAS material at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility. Permission from the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation was granted in September 2017.

PFAS is a collective term used to describe manufactured chemical compounds that provide resistance to heat, other chemicals or to abrasion and have been used for many decades in industrial processes and consumer products. Common uses for the chemicals include firefighting foam, medical imaging such as x-rays and on fabrics and cooking applications as a fire retardant.

The EMRC is working with industries and organisations, particularly defence establishments and fire training facilities, to advise and provide a local and convenient location for the appropriate disposal of PFAS.

### 7. EMRC Recycling Tips

The EMRC is very proud of our contribution to limiting waste and we can help by providing some useful tips.

### Still buying your takeaway coffee in a disposable cup?

If so, you are missing out on reducing your waste contribution but also on potentially saving money. Approximately 1 billion disposable cups are used in Australia each year and as many are plastic lined and difficult to recycle, they will end up in landfill. Instead, invest in a reusable coffee cup and use this for your next takeaway coffee. Some cafés will even offer a discount! To find cafés offering a reusable cup discount, visit <a href="https://www.responsiblecafes.org/">https://www.responsiblecafes.org/</a> or ask your local coffee shop to join up. This is an easy piece of waste to avoid!

#### What plastic can go in my recycling bin?

When it comes to determining what kind of plastic can go in the recycling bin, do the scrunch test. That means, if you can scrunch up the item (think of a chip bag) and it makes a noise, then it cannot be placed in your recycling bin. This should be placed in your local REDcycle bin (commonly found at Coles). If the plastic container is hard and contained something (think of a plastic bottle), then it should be rinsed and placed in your yellow-top recycling bin. All lids, smaller than the palm of your hand, should be placed in the general waste bin.
