In June 2013, Council resolved to extend the term of the current members of the WMCRG wishing to renominate for a further period of 18 months, from 1 July 2013 to 31 December 2014. Subsequent to this, Ms Tina Klein resigned, Ms Sally Paulin resigned, and My Trevor Brown's term was not renewed.

At the end of their December 2014 membership terms, the members informally agreed to continue in their role for as long as the EMRC wished to have their input.

REPORT

The membership of the EMRC's WMCRG has been declining in the last 2 years and most recently the long serving chairman Mr Peter Pearson announced his resignation from the group and Mr David Strain has also expressed his intention not to continue his membership. The Waste Education Officer updated the group on the waste education initiatives undertaken between May 2016 and June 2016.

• Public Recycling Updates:

- The Battery and CFL collection information is provided for the 2013/2014, 2014/2015 and 2015/2016 financial years; and
- The 2015/16 financial year saw EMRC collect 15.15 tonnes of household batteries from within our region. Detailed location information can be found in the Appendix of this report.
- o School data is being finalised for the Schools Battery Collection Program's annual competition.

- Member Councils requested to promote availability of trailer and bin lids to community groups holding events; and
- Trailer to be upgraded after consultation with RWESG as time and budget allows.

• Waste Education Networking/Promotion

- Sustainable Schools WA Hills region meeting 10 May 2016;
- Waste Educators Network Group meetings 30 June 2016; and
- Joint promotions with the other Regional Councils Nappy disposal promotion currently being worked on. Planning is underway for the Perth Royal Show.

Other Projects

- Plastic Free July Let's get ready:
 - The Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council (EMRC), in partnership with the City of Swan, Mundaring in Transition, Hills Sustainability Group, and Earth Carers, hosted Plastic Free July - Let's get ready from 9:00am to 12:00pm, Sunday 26 June 2016 in the Old Midland Courthouse:
 - Attendees made beeswax wraps, produce bags, listened to guest speakers and waste reduction demonstrations;
 - A market stall at the Farmers Markets had people make a pledge to reduce single use plastic and encouraged people to take part in the events in the Old Courthouse;
 - The event had 3 guest speakers including Amy Warne (co-founder of Plastic Free July), Lindsay Miles (author of the blog Treading My Own Path) and Amanda Welschbillig (co-owner of the Wasteless Pantry). The event also had a performance by the Eco Faeries;
 - EMRC's small set of litter letters were utilised in a display asking questions related to the use of single use plastics; and
 - The event has been seen as a success by all those involved.
- Waste and Recycling Guides for 2016/2017:
 - The Town of Bassendean, City of Bayswater, City of Belmont, Shire of Mundaring and City of Swan Guides have been completed. The Shire of Kalamunda are doing their own. Web versions will be uploaded for the five member councils on the RGang and RecyclingNearYou websites.
- Waste Audits and Waste Education Strategy Review 2016:
 - Recycling bins, greenwaste bins and additional City of Swan waste audits are being planned, to be completed late 2016. The Waste Education team are developing the documentation, once the request for quote has been completed it will be distributed; and
 - Work has begun on the review and update of the Regional Waste Education Strategy. The waste audit information will be utilised as part of the review. Workshops will be planned as part of the strategy review and development.



o Compost in May:

- Small grant received from Waste Authority to host a Compost workshop in May 2016. Workshop was held 28 May 2016 in Sawyers Valley, with 30 people attending. The workshop received positive feedback from participants.
- o Keep Australia Beautiful Council (KABC WA) Community Litter Grant Litter Letters:
 - The large set was utilised for the Toodyay Road Clean-up event and was located at the bottom of Red Hill, near Jane Brook for a month. A huge amount of positive feedback were received on the letters.
 - The Litter Letters will soon be made available for hire to member Councils and community groups.
- Toodyay Road Community Clean-up:
 - Main Roads, Keep Australia Beautiful (KAB), EMRC and the City of Swan worked together to hold a Clean-up Day along 6km of Toodyay Road on Saturday, 14 May 2016. The large Litter Letters were installed and filled with the collected rubbish on the Toodyay Road intersection of Talbot Road, as part of the event.
 - 60 volunteers attended;
 - Main Roads reported they picked up 234 bags plus large loose items for a total of 1.46 tonne. The Litter Letters contained approximately 71 bags, for a total of 280kg. Therefore total litter collected was 1.74 tonne;
 - Main Roads undertook an additional clean-up on 30 May 2016 along the steep section down the Scarp, the Toodyay Road Community Clean-up were unable to complete this section due to safety issues;
 - A huge amount of positive feedback was received for the event and the Litter Letters; and
 - A number of KAB programs have been promoted, such as Adopt A Spot and the Litter Report Scheme.

Earth Carers

The Earth Carers Training Course was held in May/June 2016, with 21 people completing the program, consisting of five sessions held over three weeks and the program continues to gain a following.

11.3 RESOURCE RECOVERY PARK UPDATE

The Manager Resource Recovery provided a progress update on the Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park progress, including the Hazelmere Wood Waste to Energy Project, the Commercial and Industrial (C&I) Waste Plant and general site development.

The following points were raised and discussed:

- C&I Waste Separation Facility;
 - o Cladding and roof installation is underway;
 - o Roads and associated drainage construction has commenced;
 - Delivery of waste sorting equipment is expected in August 2016;
 - New workshop hardstand to be constructed at the eastern side of Hazelmere Resource Recovery Park;
 - Existing workshop dome shelter relocated and concrete floor constructed;
 - Water filling station and bulk fuel storage tank relocated adjacent to dome shelter;
 - Installation of a fence and locakable gates around the workshop hardstand area is complete;
 - New sub-station ground works are complete and underground electrical conduits installed to house, C&I building and new workshop area;
 - o Relocation of power poles by Western Power; and
 - Western Power to install underground and overhead powerlines and to provide and install a transformer.



WWTE Project;

- Works approval was issued in June 2016;
- Access road has been constructed to sub base level;
- Fire ring main has been extended and hydrant installed to service the WWTE site;
- Service conduits have been installed beneath the road allowing for future connection to gas, waste water, water and electrical export cable to Perth Airport;
- Installation of a low pressure gas connection and meter will commence in July 2016;
- Ansac are now located on site;
- o Installation of underground services is underway;
- Concrete pad construction to commence 11 July 2016;
- Delivery of engines is underway;
- Mechanical completion expected end of January 2017; and
- Commissioning is expected in February 2017.

Site Development

- The commercial entrance design is currently being reviewed and assessed;
- Tender for works will follow to include construction of entrance way, installation of weighbridges, roads and drainage to link up C&I facility and existing grinder operation – expected to commence late 2016;
- Land swap for Lot 99 Lakes Road, Hazelmere is complete. Once the site has been cleared by WA Planning Commission fencing can be installed; and
- New Administration building is budgeted for this financial year.

Ms Katscherian advised that the WMCRG members would be interested in a site visit once future developments on site are completed.
